From the Pastor's Desk



The Gentle Savior in the Storm

And he saw that they were making headway painfully, for the wind was against them. And about the fourth watch of the night he came to them, walking on the sea. - Mark 6:48

As August arrives, many of us find ourselves preparing for a new school year. This time of transition often brings a mix of excitement and anxiety. We look forward to new opportunities and challenges, but we also face uncertainties and the stress of change. In this context, the story of Jesus walking on water in Mark 6:45-52 offers profound comfort and hope. Picture the scene. The disciples are straining at the oars, battling the wind and the waves in the dead of night. They are experienced fishermen, familiar with the treacherous waters, yet this

storm fills them with fear. They are struggling, exhausted, and no doubt questioning why Jesus sent them ahead in the first place.

But here is the beautiful, tender truth: Jesus sees them. From the mountainside where He had been praying, He watches over His beloved disciples. They are never out of His sight, never beyond His care. And He comes to them, walking on the sea. In the midst of their terror, they see a figure approaching on the water, and they cry out, thinking it is a ghost. Jesus immediately speaks to them, "Take heart; it is I. Do not be afraid." These words are not just a command but an invitation to trust, to find peace in His presence. Scripture tells us that Jesus' heart is gentle and lowly. Here, on the stormy sea, we see that heart in action. Jesus doesn't chastise the disciples for their fear; He meets them in it. He steps into their storm and brings calm—not just to the sea, but to their souls.

As we embark on a new school year and other endeavors, we face our own storms. The pressures of academics, the challenges of new environments, and the balancing of family schedules can all feel overwhelming. Like the disciples, we often feel like we are rowing against the wind, straining without progress. Yet, the message of Mark 6:45-52 is clear: Jesus sees us. He comes to us in our distress. His words to the disciples are His words to us: "Take heart; it is I. Do not be afraid." The essence of the Gospel is encapsulated in this moment. We are never alone in our struggles. Our Savior is not distant or detached; He is deeply involved in our lives. He comes to us, not to merely observe our plight, but to rescue us, to speak peace into our chaos. Let us hold fast to this truth as we start this new season. In every storm, Jesus is near. His heart is for us. And as we fix our eyes on Him, we will find the strength to take heart and not be afraid. For He is with us, always.

Jesus tells us He is the Bread of Life. This is one of the great "I Am" statements in John's Gospel. But what does Jesus mean by this? He gives Himself for us.

August 18, 2024 – Thirteenth Sunday after Pentecost Ideal-Ordeal-New Deal - John 6:60-69 Rev. Dr. Thomas Ahlersmever

Our walk with Jesus, like so many of our relationships, appears so wonderful in its early days. Then comes an issue or crisis that intrudes upon our faith. God be praised that our Savior has "words of eternal life" (John 6:68 ESV) that can offer the "new deal" of forgiveness and life when our ideal has become an ordeal.

August 25, 2024 – Fourteenth Sunday after Pentecost Without Wrinkle - Ephesians 5:25-27 Rev. Dr. Walter Maier III

Wrinkles – we want to avoid them, but cannot. The good news is that God sees us, and all believers, as without wrinkle, which is far more important than in the physical sense. This means that we will live forever.

We provided food to 271 individuals. They included 127 children under the age of 18, and 41 individuals over the age of 60. Our congregation provided 260# of food. We went to Community Harvest three times this month to purchase 1682# of food in the amount of \$504. Our 15 volunteers gave 108 hours of their time.

Olympic Games 2024 through the Arts. The project, called "Hymnal-Humanity Gathered" is one that their friends in Agape Art would love to have our prayers and encouragement as they combine art and sports in a way that could truly minister to the hearts and minds of those who come to the Paris Olympics! Joe and Suzy are excited that artist Eduardo Sampaio will show his work at this exhibition - the story of his coming to faith in Jesus by God's grace through the witness of Agape Art! We will start our weekly prayer focus prayers by asking the Holy Spirit to touch many hearts during the Olympics and continue His work in their spirits once they return to their home nations, to be able to be plugged into churches and/or groups of Believers who will continue to nurture their beginning seeking or opening their hearts to the Lord Jesus. We will also continue last month's prayers for the persecuted Church and secret believers in sensitive countries in the world.

August 5

Agape Art in Paris during the Olympics

Pray for Paris Agape Art and Sports during and after the Olympics! Pray that lasting changes will happen in the hearts of Olympians and visitors as a result of the outreach taking place in the heart of Paris!

August 12 The Persecuted Church in North Korea

Pray with Yun Hee, the leader of an Open Doors safe-house in China where North Korean refugees can stay. Pray for her protection in this critical role. Pray that god would lead refugees, Christians and non-Christians, to Yun Hee. Pray for her as she shows them the love of Jesus. Yun Hee admits that the work sometimes wears her out; so pray for rejuvenation for Yun Hee and all those who run the safe houses.



August 19 Persecution in Viet Nam

Pray for churches in Viet Nam's remote areas. In recent months, authorities have controlled and persecuted churches prohibiting church activities. Pray for Pastor Chien Thiang in North Vietnam, who says that authorities wanted to evict the Christians. Pray for reconciliation and for Pastor Chien Thang and his family's safety and protection. Pray that through them the Gospel would spread like wildfire.

August 26 The Nigerian Chibok girls who were kidnapped from their school 10 years ago

Praise God that another Chibok girl is free from captivity! Thank God for Lydia Simon's recent return. After 276 girls were kidnapped from their school, 106 are still missing. Ask God to hold them close and that they would keep their eyes on Him. Lydia is a mother of three and 5 months pregnant. Pray that her community would accept her and her children, and that the Chibok parents would be encouraged and keep praying for their captive daughters. Pray that more captives throughout sub-Saharan Africa would be freed!

BACK-TO-SCHOOL AND MENTAL HEALTH

The return to school can be a stressful time, whether it's the first day of kindergarten, middle school, high school. It is filled with excitement, anticipation, and apprehension. It's crucial to remember that school readiness isn't just about having the right supplies, it's also about

mental health. Student mental health challenges such as anxiety, social anxiety, depression, and stress, can be significant concerns for parents and students alike during the back-to-school season.

Anxiety

For many adolescents and teens, going to school is a normal part of their routine. But for some, the very idea triggers or intensifies stress and anxiety. Their anxiety can show up as physical symptoms, such as headaches, stomachaches, and fatigue.

Social anxiety

Social anxiety involves fears of being watched, judged by others, or of becoming a failure.

Depression

Depression in teens can look a bit different than it does in adults. Symptoms can include mood swings, irritability, angry outbursts, substance abuse, isolation, social withdrawal, and rebelliousness.

Stress

Stress can be a challenge for adolescents and teens. Academic performance can take a mental, emotional, and physical toll on their minds and bodies.

It's normal for children to feel anxious about these changes. Here's how you can help ease their worries:

Communicate: Encourage your child to express their feelings about going back to school. Acknowledge their fears, make them feel understood, and reassure them that it's perfectly normal to feel anxious about these changes.

Create Routines: A consistent routine fosters a sense of security in children. Establishing a regular sleep schedule, eating healthy meals, and setting aside time for homework and relaxation can help children adjust to the rhythm of the school year.

Provide Mental Health Days: After your child is back at school, you may find they need an occasional a break from the stress and anxiety of school and social performance. These mental health days should be structured to include proactive activities that provide rejuvenation and connection, such as going for a walk or spending one-on-one time with a parent.

There is a wealth of resources for parents, teachers, and students alike:

- <u>StopBullying.Gov</u> —can help kids prevent bullying by talking about it, building a safe school environment, and creating a community-wide bullying prevention strategy.
- <u>SchoolSafety.Gov</u> provides schools with actionable recommendations to create a safe and supportive learning environment where students can thrive and grow.
- <u>SAMHSA's National Helpline</u> <u>1-800-662-HELP (4357)</u> is a confidential, free, 24/7, 365-day-a-year information service for individuals and family members facing mental and/or substance use disorders.
- <u>FindSupport.gov</u> —designed to help people identify available resources, explore unbiased information and learn how to reach out to get the support they need for issues related to mental health, drugs, or alcohol.

As we approach the new school year, let's make 'Caring for Every Child's Mental Health' a priority. Let's commit to making the back-to-school transition about physical, academic readiness, and about mental preparedness.



GriefShare is a safe, 13-week group where you'll discover what to expect in the days ahead and what's "normal" in grief. You'll learn helpful ways of coping with grief, and gain solid support each step of the way.

Each weekly GriefShare group begins with a 30-minute video. After the video, you and the other group members will spend time discussing what was presented in the video and what is going on in your lives. Talking with other people who understand what you're experiencing brings great comfort, normalizes the grief experience, and offers a supportive environment to work through your grief.

If you have experienced the death of a family member or friend, you are invited and encouraged to register for the GriefShare program. You'll gain access to valuable resources to help you recover from your loss and look forward to rebuilding your life. GriefShare groups meet weekly to help you face these challenges and move toward rebuilding your life. The newest edition of GriefShare will be held at Bethlehem Lutheran Church, 3705 S. Anthony Blvd., Fort Wayne in Room 1 on Tuesdays starting August 20, 2024 from 5:30pm-7:00pm.

There is a suggested donation of \$10.00 for the workbook. This book helps you process your emotions and experiences and cope with the loss. You'll apply what you've heard in the group and gain tools to deal with complicated grief. Please register by August 15 by contacting Rhonda in the church office at (260) 744-3228. This program is sponsored by our Mental Health Initiative at Bethlehem.

Adopted Bethlehem Evangelical Lutheran Church Board of Directors Regular monthly Meeting June 11, 2024

Members present: Pastor Ben Ahlersmeyer, Brian Bates, Dan Bates, Evans Branigan, Rachele Dance, Caleb DeMond, Greg Shediack and John Stafford Members absent: Natalie Reynolds

Guests: Doug Reynolds

The June 2024 regular monthly meeting of the Board was opened at 6:34 PM by President Greg Shediack.

Pastor Ahlersmeyer began the meeting with a devotion based on 2nd Corinthians Chapter 1 verses 3-7. Jesus comforts us so that we can comfort others, giving us a reason for our sufferings. Pastor concluded the devotion with prayer.

The Board next reviewed the minutes from its May 14, 2024 meeting. There being no changes offered, John Stafford moved for their approval and the motion was seconded by Dan Bates. The motion passed unanimously.

Treasurer Brian Bates presented the May 2024 Financial Report. Monthly income for May was \$25,809 compared with a budgeted amount of \$26,833. Year-to-date income through May was \$159,523, including a \$25,000 withdrawal from the SSMG Fund. Monthly expenses for May totaled \$32,941, compared with monthly budget amount of \$40,010. Year-to-date expenses through May were \$185,605. Brian further presented a breakout of expenses through May by major category. He noted that through five months, we have expended 38.7 percent of the budgeted total. The balance in the Endowment Fund at the end of May was \$1,144,363. The balance in the SSMG Scholarship Fund was \$35,220. The Financial Report was unanimously approved as submitted on a motion by Brian Bates and a second by Caleb DeMond.

The Soul Accounting report from the Board of Elders included the deaths of member Greg Shroeder on May 2nd and Terry Bratton on May 15th.

The Pastor's report included an update on his studies toward his Doctorate of Ministry. His classes end for the Summer the week of June 10th and will resume in the Fall. A Bible class on empathy will be conducted on Tuesdays for three weeks, beginning June 18th.

John Stafford presented information to the Board on an opportunity to submit a grant application to Indiana Landmarks under their Sacred Places Indiana program. Mark Blessing has been taking the lead in preparing a draft application. We can request up to \$25,000 for a "New Dollars/New Partners" section of the Indiana Landmarks program. The application would request funds for examining potential improvements to the building which may be needed to as a part of the Neighborhood Mission Rejuvenation Plan. The application is due by June 30, 2024. John asked for the Board's authorization to submit this grant application. Upon a motion by Brian Bates and a second by Caleb DeMond, the Board approved the authorization to submit the application. Pastor also reported to the Board that a member offered to contribute \$5,000 toward expenses necessary to assess building improvements which may be needed to reutilize currently underutilized portions of the building.

Under New Business, the Board considered a request from the Board of Property Management to replace the tubes and the refractory in the boiler. Multiple quotes for the work were sought by Dan Scheerer on behalf of the Board of Property Management and the recommendation is to accept the bid from Combustion Mechanical, Inc. for \$29,750. Brian Bates moved that the Board of Directors authorize the Board of Property Management to accept the proposal from Combustion Mechanical, Inc. and proceed to start the project with an upper limit on the expenditure of \$30,000. The motion was seconded by Rachele Dance and passed unanimously.

The Board was also updated on the trimming of trees on our property which were overhanging a portion of the roof and potentially harming it. The expense total approximately \$4,000 and will be paid from the Board of Property Management line in the annual operating budget.

The Board next discussed the need to upgrade our hearing assistance devices. It was noted that the congregation had received a \$3,000 donation to offset the expenses of the upgrade. The Board authorized Pastor Ben to proceed with securing the new devices for an amount not to exceed \$3,000 on a motion by John Stafford and a second by Dan Bates.

Continued

Doug Reynolds presented the Board with an opportunity to enter into an arrangement with Mt. Calvary Lutheran Church to accept their Steinway piano in exchange for a contribution of \$3,000. Funds for this contribution will come from the Congregational Life line in the budget as some other expected expenses are coming in at a lower amount than expected. Bethlehem will also be responsible for any associated moving expenses. Given that this expenditure is within the annual operating budget, no Board motion was needed. However, there was support among Board members that this was an exceptional opportunity.

There being no further business to come before the Board, Evans Branigan moved and Rachele Dance seconded for adjournment. After Pastor closed with prayer, the meeting was adjourned at 7:52 PM.

The 100th Anniversary Committee met and have a few dates and a theme for our 100th Anniversary. Our theme will be:




