From the Pastor's Desk

A Unique Community

*"Now you are the body of Christ and individually members of it."
1 Corinthians 12:27*



It was the day after our big community festival. So much work had gone into that event the day before. So many people stepped up to accomplish the work together. I know it was hot. I know we had some wind come through and almost carry away some of our tents. There are always ways to improve, to get more folks to show up, to create better flow or whatever but it was a great day! We had neighbors come out to meet us, probably many for the first time. We got to know each other better too. There was much to celebrate! The next morning, when we gathered for worship, something tremendous hit me. Have you ever had that in church? You are saying some part of the liturgy that you've spoken a hundred times before but this particular time it just hits you different. Well, for me it was the Apostles' Creed.

I typically love the second article of the creed. It's the part that talks about Jesus and all that He has done for us. I also really love the part in the third article that mentions the resurrection of the body. That is not a confession of what we believe about Jesus, by the way. We already confessed His resurrection in the previous article. The third article gives us a chance to confess our hope in our *own* resurrection some day. It wasn't those parts that hit me particularly that day. It was this little line I've confessed thousands of times without a ton of thought: I believe in the Holy Spirit, *the holy Christian church*.... It struck me just then that every week we all confess together that we believe in the power of the Holy Spirit working through God's church. We had seen it all in action just the day before as we came together to serve and witness and play at a community festival. By God's grace, we did it together as the Church.

As I have admitted in several sermons lately, the work of ministry is hard. It is unlike any other work that is out in the world. We don't count widgets at the end of the day. We can't put numbers on our work. We try at times with attendance and offerings. Those numbers indicate something but those don't tell the whole story of the work of the church. Because we can't measure our work the way the world does, it can sometimes feel as though we aren't accomplishing anything. And those negative thoughts can spiral out to convince us that our organization is obsolete, or at the very least irrelevant to the neighbors around us. And yet, every Sunday we speak those same words together: *I believe in the holy Christian church*.

That confession is a reminder that the Church is not our creation to sustain. It is Christ's. He continues to gather sinners around His Word and Sacraments. He continues to forgive sins, strengthen faith, and send His people into the world. He continues to work through ordinary Christians in ordinary acts of love. What we experienced at the community festival was just one small glimpse of that reality. It was more than just an event, celebrating 100 years of our existence. It was the Church being the Church.

Thank you for continuing to be the church here. Thank you for continuing to live out what we confess every week in those words: *I believe in the holy Christian church*. I know it isn't always easy. I know we don't always see those immediate results that we crave but God continues to work through us. Thank you for serving, praying, inviting, encouraging, and loving your neighbors. Those acts may not always seem dramatic, but this is how Jesus has chosen to make Himself known in and to the world. He does this through His people, gathered around His gifts and sent into their neighborhoods in His name. May He continue to make Bethlehem a place where our neighbors encounter not merely a building or an organization, but the living Body of Christ, filled with His grace and sent in His name.

We provided food to 271 individuals. They included 127 children under the age of 18, and 41 individuals over age 60.

Our congregation provided 260# of food. We went to Community Harvest three times this month to purchase 1682# of food in the amount of \$504. Our 15 volunteers gave 108 hours of their time.

Continuing its year-long 100th anniversary celebration, Bethlehem Lutheran Church hosted a community festival on July 18. The event drew more than 200 participants, mostly children from the nearby neighborhoods.

The day included Nathan hot dogs, chips, popcorn and water, an incredibly popular dunk tank, two bouncy houses, icy treats, a children's game area, book giveaways, free T-shirts and a Fort Wayne Fire Department truck which could be explored. Representatives from Connect, Meridian and Shepherd's Hand distributed health information, and there were also face-painting, balloon animals, tattoos, bingo and corn-hole games available. Changing Footprints, which is housed in Bethlehem, also handed out dozens of pairs of shoes.

Barb Netterville, who organized the event planning before passing Jan. 16, was succeeded by Denise DeYampert, who led about 50 volunteers, with help from 100th anniversary coordinator Sharon Dietrich. A plaque honored Netterville's efforts, saying "God has you in His arms, we have you in our hearts. Well done good and faithful servant... well done."

The next scheduled anniversary events are an Aug. 8 clean-up day at Lutheran South Unity from 9 a.m. to 12 p.m., and an alumni weekend on Sept. 12 and 13. On Sept. 12, a Bethlehem Church and School Alumni dance and reunion will be held at the Allen County Fairgrounds, and former Bethlehem student and Pastor Steve Ensley returns to lead the following Sunday 9 a.m. service with a reception to follow.

Back-to-School Anxiety

Heading back to school can be an exciting, yet stressful time. For many children, anxiety and mixed emotions are part of the transition.

Whether your child is starting school for the first time, attending a new school, or returning for a new year at their old school, it's a really good time for parents and caregivers to check in with their kids to see how they're feeling and how they're processing this important time in their life.

It is important to get kids back on a regular sleep schedule in the days and weeks leading up to the start of school, it's also important to establish other school-day routines and not wait until the first day of school."

Back-to-school time is not the only time adults need to be concerned about their children's mental health. Over the last 20 years, youth mental health disorders have increased, and the COVID pandemic exacerbated the scope of the struggle. Today, it is estimated that one in five kids has a significantly impaired mental disorder.

Parents may be shocked to learn that half of all lifetime mental health disorders start by the age of 14, and that less than half of kids identified with a mental health disorder get the treatment they need. Be vigilant for signs of loneliness, sadness, and hopelessness in your children. It's normal for children to experience a bit of anxiety from time to time. But when that anxiety impairs a child's ability to participate in school, activities, and relationships with peers, it is time to seek the help of mental health services.

Depression and anxiety look different in kids than in adults. In adults, depression may manifest itself as sadness, while in children it may display as irritability, refusal to participate in certain activities, or non-compliance with rules and requirements. They don't always wear their thoughts on their sleeves.

Over the last few years, LLV has been gradually building or buying other campuses on the southwest, north and northwest sides of the Fort Wayne area, and some of you may know that the original Lutheran Home was in Kendallville; my grandparents moved there from their home on Hanna St. in Ft. Wayne! Both Bob and I have had parents, aunts and uncles live here at the large campus on South Anthony since the 1970s, and the beautiful Chapel was built to unite the older and newer buildings and become the spiritual focus of the campus!

We are so thankful that Bethlehem Lutheran Church has been led of the Lord to stay on the the South Side, where He planted us 100 years ago, seeking the Holy Spirit's guidance on how He best knows to reach out and disciple the people around us! We here at this South Anthony Facility, which will no longer be named LLV, believe the Lord is not done with using us to minister Jesus' Light and Word among us here! But we do ask for your prayers during and after the transition. We do know that the only present Chaplain who will staying here, come September, is Rev. 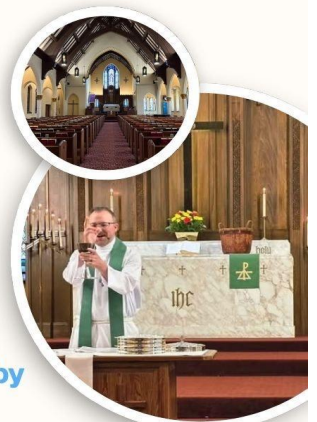
